





Announcement

The General Secretariat of the King Salman International Award for Graduate Studies in the History and Civilization of the Arabian Peninsula announces the start of accepting nominations for the award in its third session. The award is dedicated to master's and doctoral theses in the field of the history and civilization of the Arabian Peninsula from Saudi universities and other foreign universities, according to the following criteria and conditions:

- 1. The award nomination is open to all master's theses (or equivalent) and doctoral dissertations from Saudi universities and other foreign universities.
- 2. The nomination for the award must be submitted by academic departments or research centers in Saudi universities or other global universities, accompanied by an official letter detailing the reasons for nomination, description of the nominated work, and a report on the merits of the thesis, with the results achieved through or due to the work, along with a CV of the nominee.
- 3. The nominated work for the award should be pioneering and of high quality and originality (and has not been previously published).
- 4. The thesis submitted for the award should not exceed two years from the date of obtaining the academic degree.
- 5. The nomination for the award must be through the designated nomination form
- 6. Nominated works should be submitted to the General Secretariat in both Arabic and English
- 7. The nominated work must pass the criteria set by the scientific committee of the award.

Notes:

- The nomination applications will be accepted starting Tuesday, 19/11/2024 (corresponding to 17/5/1446).
- The last date for receiving nomination applications is Sunday, 13/4/2025 (corresponding to 15/10/1446).
- "Nomination entities may submit more than one work, provided that the previous conditions are met, and the total number does not exceed three theses for each academic degree (Master's (or equivalent) and Doctorate) in the three tracks of Arabian Peninsula history (Ancient History Islamic and Medieval History Modern and Contemporary History).
- All submitted works will be subject to confidential evaluation to ensure the winning works achieve the highest levels of scientific and methodological standards that befits the award and its reputation in research and academic circles.".
- All nomination papers and submitted theses will not be returned to their senders.
- All correspondence should be addressed to His Highness, Prince, Nayef bin Thunayan Al Saud, General Supervisor of King Salman's center for Historical and Civilization Studies of Arabian Peninsula, and Secretary-General of the Award.
